BARON DONATES ENGRAVING SERVICES FOR NSW EVENT



In April, Baron Technology, Inc. donated its engraving services to a worthy cause: a fund-raising event for the Naval Special Warfare (NSW) Foundation's Gala, which took place on April 9 in Greenville, South Carolina. The Baron Custom Engraving Shop hand-engraved a Bond Arms, Inc. double-barrel Snake Slayer IV .45 Colt with an NSW Trident insignia on the right side and the

Underwater Demolition Team emblem on the left side; both are gold-filled. In front of the hammer, the outline of the Trident insignia was engraved and gold-filled, and each side of the receiver has beautiful scroll work running on the curved part and on each side of the barrel. A gold-filled, lone trident runs the length of the barrel's top section. The hand-engraving work was done by artisan Rob Bunting.

BARON WORK HELPS WSF AUCTION

Earlier this year, Baron Technology, Inc. customized a Winchester rifle for USA Shooting that was to be auctioned off at the Wild Sheep Foundation (WSF) convention. Taking place on February 12 in Reno, Nevada, during the closing night of the “Sheep Show” banquet, the rifle was auctioned off three times (first two bidders donated it back) and it went for \$55K, \$55K and \$30K, respectively, to generate a total of \$140K for the support of the shooting team.

CELEBRATING THE 100TH INDY 500

An idea to commemorate the 100th running of the Indianapolis 500 turned a half-dozen Colt .45 1911 handguns into collector's items for six lucky people. Using selective silver plating for the images, the guns featured engraving on each side of the slide, with an image of the first car to win the 1911 race and one from the '70s on the left side, and a checkered flag (near the hammer) and a scroll containing the words "100 YEARS, COLT 1911, 100TH ANNIVERSARY" on the right.

On the slide's top is an image of the BorgWarner Trophy, also made with selective silver plating.

The recipients were all folks who helped to plan and execute the race, along with those who sponsored the Colt race car.
